GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF CLASS:

This is responsible Police work in the protection of life and property through the enforcement of laws and ordinances. Work primarily involves processing red light violations, using web based tools. Assignments are received from superior officers and are carried out under established policies and procedures. Employees in this class must exercise considerable judgment and skill. Performance is reviewed through conferences, handwritten and computer written reports inspections and observations by superiors.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Monitors and processes red light cameras and speed violations.
2. Demonstrates proficiency in the use and care of firearms.
3. Supports and implements the community oriented policing concept.
4. Enforces State, Federal and local laws and ordinances.

ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. May prepare written reports, memorandums, and other correspondence.
2. May compile, sort and verify accuracy of data.
3. May keep record of work completed.
4. May be required to testify in court, to include code enforcement and red light camera hearings.
5. Performs related work as required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES:

1. Extensive knowledge of First Responder First Aid.
2. Thorough knowledge of federal, state and local laws and ordinances rules of evidence and laws regarding search and seizure.
3. Knowledge of departmental policies, rules and regulations.
4. Knowledge of principles, practices and equipment used in police work.
5. Knowledge of the city's geography.
6. Skill in the use of firearms and other police equipment.
7. Ability to give chase on foot in the course of law enforcement/criminal apprehension activities.
8. Ability to develop and maintain effective working relationships with the general public, other public agencies, the media, City officials and between bureaus, divisions and units of the Police Department.
9. Ability to physically restrain persons in the course of law enforcement activities.
10. Ability to use a variety of communications skills to interact formally and informally with various community and ethnic groups.
11. Ability to use special techniques to establish and maintain professional contact with juveniles.
12. Ability to lift and/or move heavy objects or persons in the course of rescue activities.
13. Ability to work in conditions which are disagreeable in respect to exposure to the elements, exposure to hazardous materials or equipment, with the threat of bodily harm.

WORKING ENVIRONMENT/CONDITIONS:

Requires active work that involves sitting most of the time and routine keyboard operations.
The job risks exposure to no significant environmental hazards
The job requires normal visual acuity, and field of vision, hearing, speaking and color perception.

QUALIFICATIONS (EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE):

1. 30 semester credit hours or 48 quarter hours from an accredited college or university OR Three (3) years Law Enforcement experience with another agency the size of Lakeland Police Department or three (3) years military experience.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must possess a valid state of Florida driver's license.
2. Must maintain a valid telephone number.
3. Applicants must meet all requirements established by the Florida Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission. Applicants must also possess a current state of Florida police officer certification or meet Commission Comparable Compliance. The requirements are enumerated in F.S. 943.13.
4. Applicants will be required to pass an extensive background investigation which includes, but is not limited to, a polygraph exam, physical agility test, drug screening examination, physical exam, psychological testing, credit checks, etc., prior to being offered employment as a Lakeland Police Officer.
5. May be required to work overtime, or alternate hours, as necessary for the efficient operation of the department. Position may be designated as Mission Critical by Department Director.

NOTICE: All education and/or experience requirement must be fully met. Consideration for exception will only be given to recruits who display exemplary law enforcement experience or other circumstances. Exceptions to any requirements will be at the sole discretion of the Chief of Police.
