

# Statewide Safer-At-Home Order

## Issued April 1, 2020

Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis issued a statewide safer-at-home order that will last through the end of April. The biggest question Floridians probably have: What is and isn't allowed?



### What's Allowed

- Floridians can go to the grocery store or pharmacy for food and essential items. Senior shopping hours are still in effect, as well.
- You can take a walk, ride your bike, jog and be outside for exercise, as long as you practice social distancing guidelines, like staying 6 feet away from others.
- You can go to a restaurant to order takeout. The executive order states: " All businesses or organizations are strongly encouraged to provide delivery, carry-out or curbside service outside of the business or organization."
- You can go to medical appointments, however, check with your doctor first or consider virtual visits.
- You can care for a family member or loved one.

### What's NOT Allowed

- You can't go to work unless you are providing essential service as defined by the order. Individuals are encouraged to work from home.
- You can't visit friends and family if there is no urgent need.
- You can't ignore social distancing guidelines and must maintain at least 6 feet of space between you and others when you go out.

### Essential Businesses
