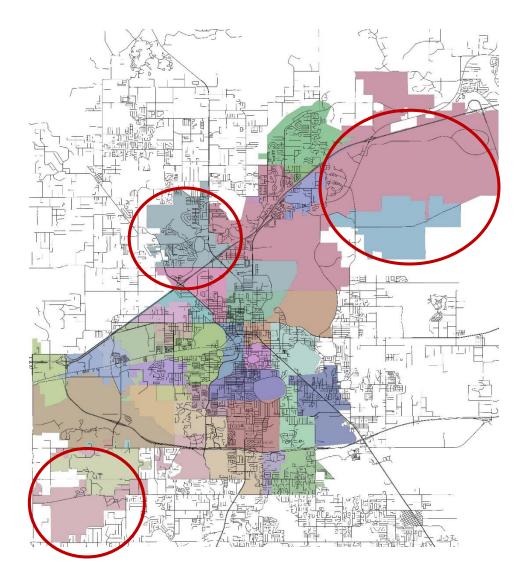


The location of an eighth fire station will be driven by **demand for service** and **response times**.

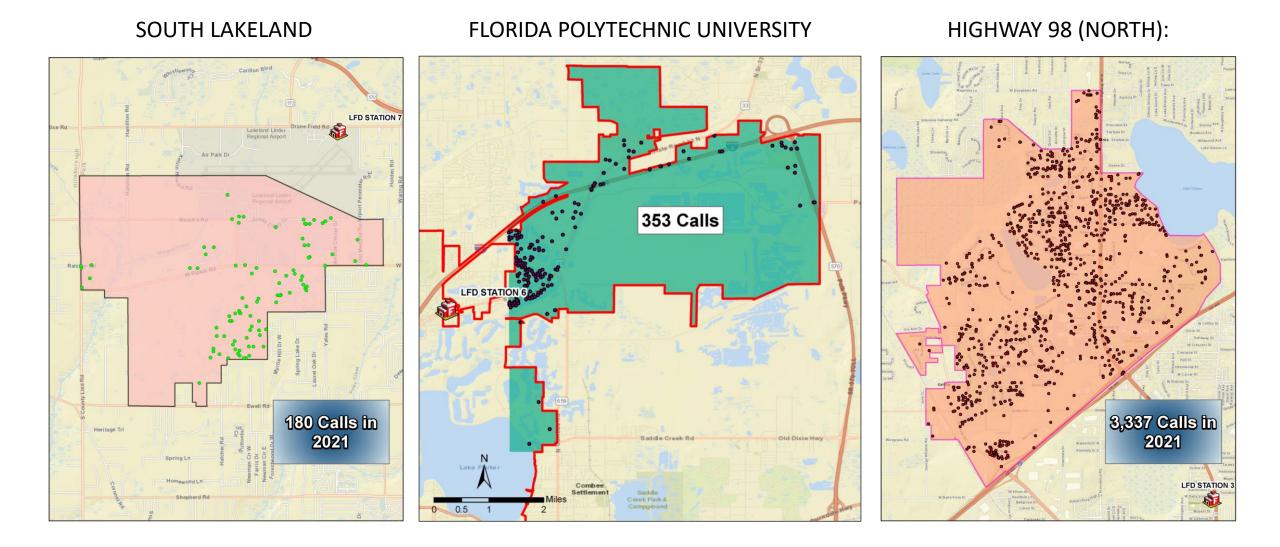

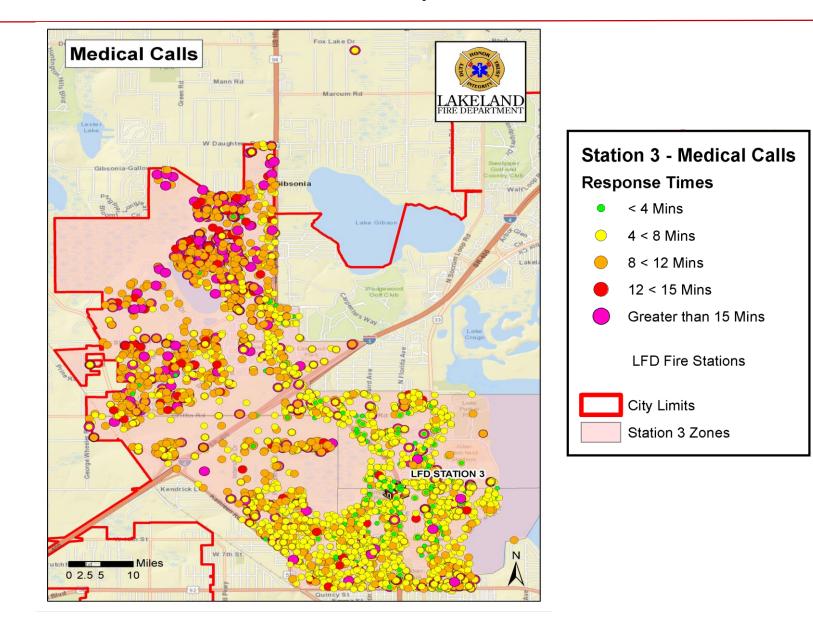
## Areas Being Monitored



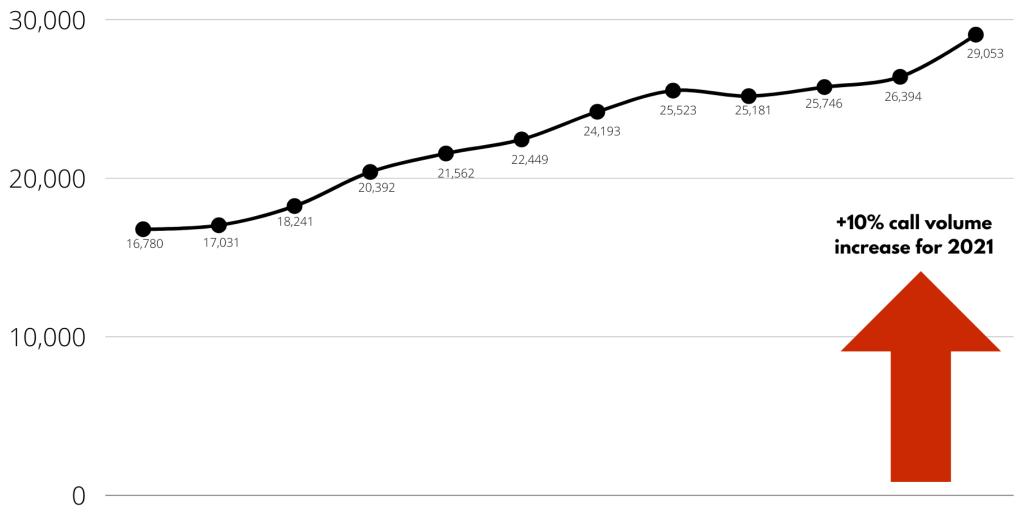
## 2021 Calls for Service



## North of I-4 Exceeds Response Standards

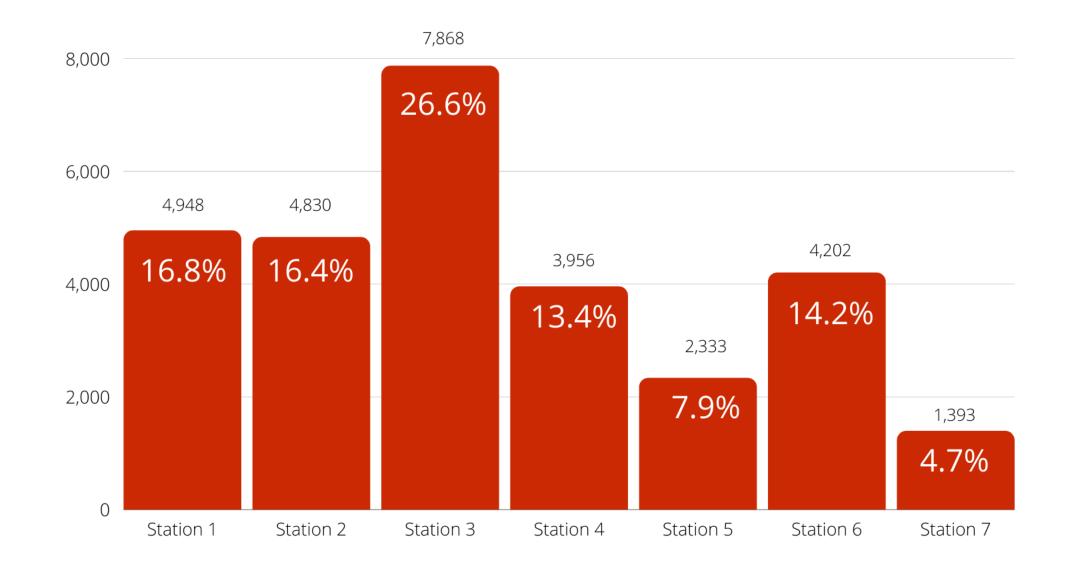


## Annual Calls for Service: All 7 Fire Stations

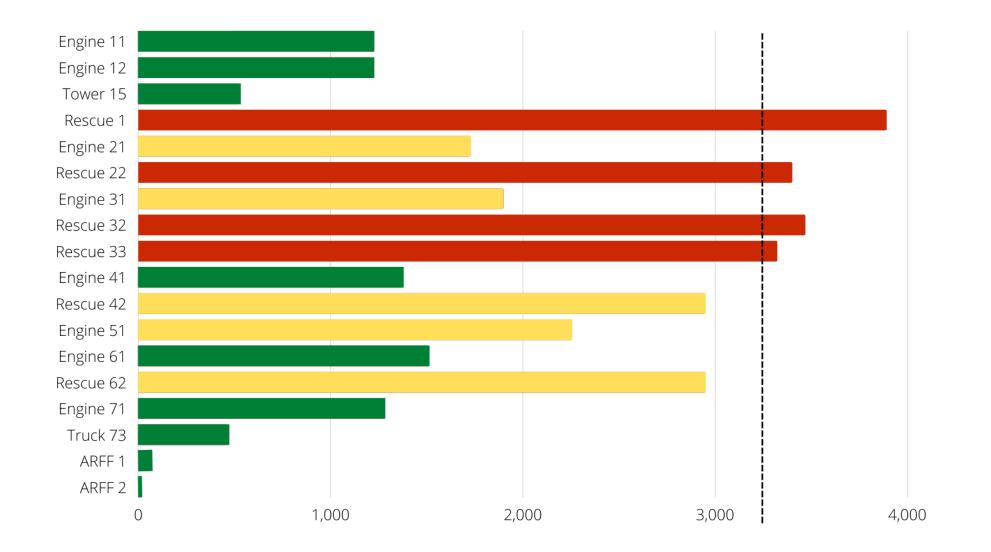

Challenges to be addressed:

- Heavy volume of calls for service in North Lakeland
- Extended response times due to traffic density and distance
- Will continue to increase as demand for service expands
- Reached resource capacity (R32 and R33 and personnel)

## Relocating Station 3

#### PROS

- Aging infrastructure of current station
- More central location decreases response time to North Lakeland

#### CONS

- Increases response times to areas
  South of I-4
- Lack of affordable property
- Doesn't address the high call volume with current resources

## Adding Station 8

#### PROS

- Availability of more affordable property
- Reduces response times to North Lakeland
- Addresses the capacity issues with current apparatus and personnel
- Positive impact to our ISO rating

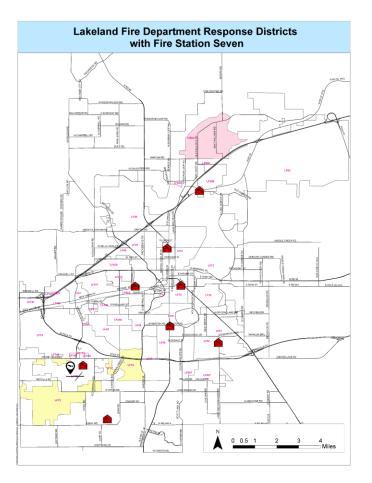
#### CONS

Cost to purchase property, build a new station, additional personnel and additional apparatus and equipment

## Projected Costs to add a New Fire Station

- Property
- Construction
- Furnishings
- Personnel
- Fire Engine & Equipment
- Total Year 1 \$5.9 M
- Total Year 2 \$1.3 M (Recurring)
- Potential LPD Sub-Station (Costs not included)
- \$1.5 M \$2.2 M (2-bays) \$160 K \$1.2 M (12 FTEs) \$880 K

# **Additional Staffing Request**

## How did we get here.....

- No new officers (Patrol, Investigative, Operational), except for SRO's since FY17
- SRO and Marjory Stoneman Douglas Act unfunded demands caused resources to be moved to SRO from other sections
- Population Increases every year and will continue
- Calls for Service continue to increase
- Unable to ask for more Patrol Officers as we could not get current vacancies filled to authorized strength.
- Only have 4 vacancies now and building a hiring list due to recruiting efforts.

# Growth

## Southwest Lakeland

- Airport, Airport Road, Riverstone and Pipkin Rd area
- Industrial parks

## **Northeast Lakeland**

 State Road 33 – Apartment and Industrial expansion from Old Combee Road to Florida Poly corridor



# **Staffing Studies**

## Per Capita / Ratio Study

- FDLE and ratio based on officers per 1000 of census population
- Statewide recommendation of:
  - 2.36/1000 not including SROs
  - 2.59/1000 including SROs
- LPD is currently at 2.17/1000 ratio based on 2021 population
- An average of both FDLE ratios & the 2022 estimated population (117,046) – 35 additional sworn officers are recommended.
- Will increase each year that population increases.



# **Staffing Studies**

## Workload Assessment

- Based on Staffing Analysis from USDOJ/COPS Office
  - Recommends additional 26 sworn officers
- Based on Analysis using a Freezemeyer Study
  - Recommends 29 additional sworn officers
- Both take into account Obligated and Unobligated time and Shift Relief Factors in formulas
- Factored into analysis are the following:
  - Calls for Service, Administrative and Follow-Up time, Back-Ups,



Paid Time Off, Training time, etc.

## Fiscal Year - \$2,540,000 (Estimated) Annually beyond FY23 - \$1,570,000 (Estimated)
