11. Landscaping/gardens (65 / 3.7%)



TARGET AREA 7: Public Safety

250 Body-worn Cameras (BWC)

- 179 deployed
- Issued to all front-facing uniformed members (Uniform Patrol, Traffic, School Resource and Street Crimes)
- Only remaining groups to be issued are Administration and Detectives
 - To be completed by end of February

165 In-car Video Systems (marked units)

- Installation for available cars expected to be complete by mid-February
- Remaining 40 or so will be installed when new cars arrive this spring in lieu of installing into 7 to 9-year-old cars only to take out a few months later.

Cell Phones

- Cell phones issued to all sworn members to be used in conjunction with Axon's evidence.com for increased efficiency
- Cell phones for Public Safety Aides have been ordered



TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Interview Room Solution

Installation scheduled for first week of March

New

- New BWC/Tasers requested for new FTEs
- Upgrade to unlimited cloud storage for Non-Axon devices from 75 TB (this will help end on premise storage needs.)
- Adding more licenses for Media Relations, Crime Scene, and PSAs to be able to use evidence.com



STAFFING UPDATE

Officers

- 270 Sworn Positions (includes the 15 new positions)
- 18 Open Positions
 - 9 Applicants, currently in the Background Review Process, expected to start in May (3) and Summer (6)
 - 9 Current Vacancies
 - Two recent retirements and one recruit resignation
 - Currently processing certified officer applications
 - Two recruiting fairs scheduled for March
- Expect to sponsor Police Academy recruits in October
 - 6 Additional Officers budgeted for FY 2024



STAFFING UPDATE

911 Dispatchers

- 39 Positions
- 6 Current Vacancies
 - 3 vacancies due to transfers within the agency for other opportunities
 - Expect to issue conditional officers for all vacant positions this week

Public Safety Aides

- 10 positions
- Currently full
 - Expect to lose two in early Spring as they advance to becoming sworn Lakeland Police Officers



RECRUITING & RETENTION - OFFICERS

Pay

- Stability with a guaranteed 3-year contract
- Slightly above other Polk agencies

Additional Benefits

- Academy sponsorships that include salary and benefits
- Training and equipment provided
- Take-home car radius
- \$5K bonus State of Florida Be A Florida Hero Program

Challenges

- Longer step pay plan than other agencies
- Broader tattoo policy Currently under discussion
- Load-bearing vests Currently under discussion
